# Committed to making a difference



We are pleased to share the company's firstever annual community giving report.

Although this is our first report, FedPoint's track record of giving is as old as the organization itself. For nearly 20 years, FedPoint employees have been a driving force for active community engagement and a guiding voice for our charitable donations.

Whether serving meals to the homeless, organizing food drives, providing warm coats, ensuring kids have school supplies and lunches, making the holidays special for seniors, sending military care packages, cleaning up our beaches, or helping local nonprofits paint, clean, and repair their facilities, teams of FedPoint employees are regularly inspired and, through their actions, inspire others to actively generate positive change in our community.

Through our annual giving survey, employees help direct our financial support by identifying the causes they believe are most important. In 2021, FedPoint contributed more than \$325,000 to address veterans' issues, domestic violence, hunger, homelessness, addiction, mental illness, and more.

Over the past five years, employees have helped direct approximately \$1 million FedPoint dollars in support of these and other causes.

Of course, the past two years have been unlike any other in our company's and our community's history. The COVID-19 crisis continues to test organizations and stretch our local nonprofits to their limits. As the crisis unfolded, we extended and continue to extend special COVID-related financial support to local nonprofits and first responder organizations so they can continue to fulfill their missions.

#### We Give

Through donations, sponsorships, matching employee gifts, and other vehicles, we partner with local nonprofits to understand their needs and support their efforts to make our community a better place.





#### We Serve

Whether through service days, care packages, clothing drives, providing educational supplies, in-kind donation of goods, or support of cause-related community events, we look for ways to help organize and mobilize service opportunities for our employees to assist our nonprofit community partners.

#### We Volunteer

Passionate, committed people are the heart of any company or cause. We provide employees multiple paid days off each year to volunteer in their communities and encourage and support organized volunteering among employees and teams.



## Our approach to giving

Because community needs are complex and our employees' preferences for how they make their impact are diverse, strong community giving programs cannot be singular in their approach. Our approach offers a variety of ways to support our local nonprofit organizations.



#### **Corporate Donations**

FedPoint identifies a core group of community partner organizations that impact change in areas important to employees and supports them through sustained financial contributions.



#### **Survey Says**

Choosing from a list of organizations suggested by employees in FedPoint's annual giving survey, employees vote for one organization each month to receive a company donation.



#### **Employee-requested Donations**

Each year, employees can request FedPoint donate up to \$500 in the employee's name to a local nonprofit organization of their choice.



#### **Sponsorships**

FedPoint invests in sponsorships that help nonprofits aligned with the causes employees believe are important.



#### **Jeans Day**

Employees give a few dollars a month to wear jeans when in the office. This amount is matched by the company and then donated each month to a local nonprofit selected by employees.



#### **Volunteer Hours**

Employees are given 16 hours each year to perform volunteer work in their communities.




#### **Matching Gifts**

Employees are able to extend their personal giving by submitting for a match up to \$100 annually for qualified nonprofit organizations.

## Key community partners

FedPoint partners with organizations in the Seacoast community whose missions align with the issues identified as most important to our employees. We work with these organizations to gauge their current needs and services, and focus on ways we can best help the communities they serve through both financial and volunteer support.



Cornerstone Visiting Nurse Association is an independent nonprofit home, health, and hospice organization serving New Hampshire and Maine. Their mission is to promote the optimum level of well-being, independence, and dignity of those living in the community by providing trusted, compassionate, and expert health care.



HAVEN is dedicated to addressing public health through violence prevention and providing services to improve the well-being of children and families. Preventing abuse and providing support for those impacted by domestic and sexual violence leads to healthier, more secure children and adults.



Cross Roads House provides emergency and transitional shelter to homeless men, women, and children in the Seacoast area. They provide homeless families and individuals with basic necessities, as well as the tools and guidance they need to return to permanent housing.



Hope on Haven Hill provides genderresponsive residential, outpatient, and recovery support substance use disorder services for pregnant, post-partum, and parenting women in New Hampshire.



Gather is committed to ending local hunger through collaboration and leadership. They serve those in the community experiencing hunger by providing nutritious food through innovative distribution programs.



My Friend's Place provides home-like emergency shelter and transitional housing, as well as exceptional support for the homeless men, women, and families in its service area.



Krempels Center is a nonprofit organization dedicated to improving the lives of people living with brain injury. Krempels Center offers programs that engage its members in meaningful and productive experiences and provides ongoing support and resources to survivors and their families.



The mission of York Community Service Association is to partner with York residents who are in need of support, services, and referrals during a difficult time in their lives with the help of staff, volunteers, and the community.

### Community spotlights

Over the years, FedPoint has consistently supported organizations whose mission has aligned with the values of our organization and business partners. Three such organizations are the Federal Employee Education & Assistance Fund, Leadership Seacoast, and Veterans Count. Through these relationships, we've been able to provide financial support, volunteer help, and opportunities for our employees to get involved.



FEDERAL EMPLOYEE EDUCATION & ASSISTANCE FUND

Since 2002, FedPoint has supported the Federal Employee Education & Assistance Fund (FEEA), the only independent, nonprofit 501c3 organization devoted solely to providing emergency financial assistance and scholarships to our dedicated civilian federal and postal public servants and their families.

FedPoint has contributed nearly \$700,000 to FEEA's scholarship program, which awards scholarships to deserving federal families. In addition, we have contributed to FEEA's tutoring program and its emergency aid assistance during times of acute community need like large-scale flooding or storms.

Since 2015, FedPoint has supported employees' participation in Leadership Seacoast, a nonprofit, civic engagement organization whose mission is to develop a base of knowledgeable and engaged community members by exploring community issues and providing opportunities for personal involvement.

FedPoint pays for the program's application fees and the tuition for FedPoint employees who are accepted into the program. As of December 2021, 13 FedPoint employees have graduated from the program. Some are now members of the Leadership Seacoast Board of Directors. Additionally, FedPoint has been a longtime sponsor of Leadership Seacoast's Government Day.

Participation in Leadership Seacoast provides FedPoint employees with a unique opportunity to not only learn the inner-workings of the Seacoast's environmental, political, social service, and community and/or economic development scenes, but also expands their network with local influencers.



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FedPoint has partnered with and supported Veterans Count since 2014. Veterans Count ensures our veterans and their families have the services they need in times of transition and hardship.

As the philanthropic arm of Easterseals Military and Veterans Services, Veterans Count provides critical and timely financial assistance and services when no other resource is available to service members, veterans and their families, to ensure their dignity, health and overall well-being.

FedPoint has contributed approximately \$650,000 in financial support to date. Each year, FedPoint supports and volunteers at many Veterans Count events, including the annual Make 12 Hours Count radiothon (as the presenting sponsor), its annual Pack and Boots road race, as well the annual gala.







### Commemorating 9/11

To recognize the 20th anniversary of 9/11, FedPoint made two \$10,000 donations in honor of the bravery and sacrifice of first responders and all frontline personnel who responded in our country's time of need and continue to do so today as we navigate the global pandemic.

#### **Emergency Nurses Association**

FedPoint presented members of the New Hampshire chapter of the Emergency Nurses Association (NH ENA) with a \$10,000 contribution to help support its mission to advocate for patient safety and excellence in emergency nursing practice, and be the global emergency nursing resource and advocate for safe practice and safe care.



### Professional Firefighters of New Hampshire

FedPoint contributed \$10,000 to the Professional Firefighters of New Hampshire (PFFNH) in support of its Fallen Firefighters Fund. The fund was established in 2002, in the wake of 9/11, so that in the event of a line-of-duty death, the PFFNH could provide immediate assistance to the family.
